## ***Bibliography of British and Irish History(BBIH)***

The product of a partnership between the Society, the Institute of Historical Research, and the publisher Brepols.

Features of the Bibliography:

- a database of over 500,000 records, by far the most complete online bibliographical resource on British and Irish history, including relations with the empire and Commonwealth;

- links to library catalogues, Google Books, selected on-line book reviews, and full text versions of articles;
- new features include enhanced searching speeds, greater visibility for the subject and place hierarchies, an auto-complete function, an auto record count per search field, a multilingual interface, and extended export possibilities (including Refworks and Endote)
